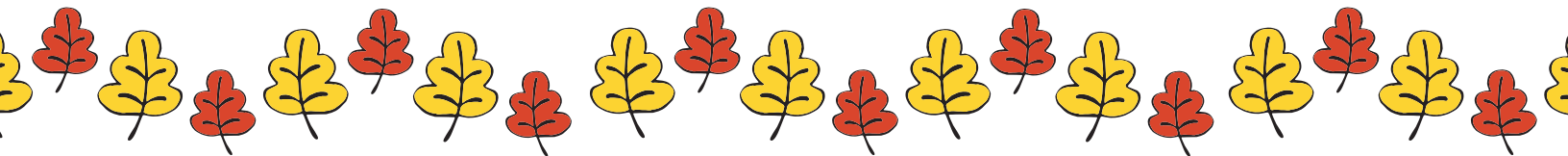

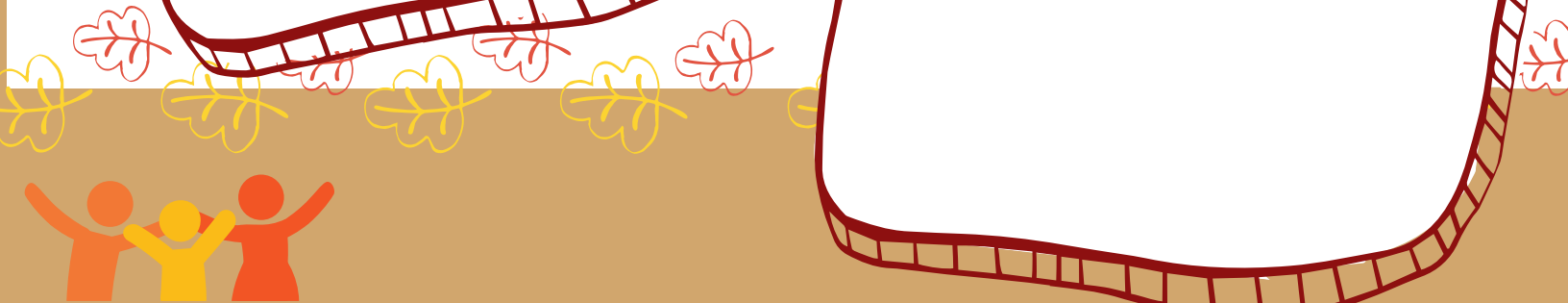

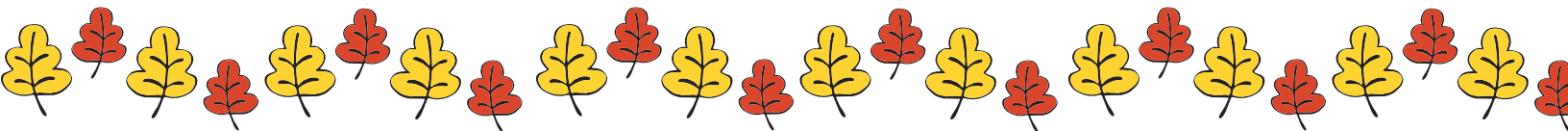
## Activity 2

Knowing how to set the table can be a very useful skill. A basic table setting can be used for everyday meals, but when you are serving a very special meal a formal table setting is used. Use the table setting diagram on the next page to help you know how to set the table for your family

Moonbeams: Color the table setting, you can even design your own plate!

Sunbeams/Explorers: Cut out the different pieces and glue them on construction paper. You can color and decorate your table setting too!

Girl Guards/Rangers: Plan a meal in your house, either for your whole family or just you. Take time to set the table. This could be for a special occasion or just a regular meal.

Having good manners means saying thank you. Read Luke 17:11-19

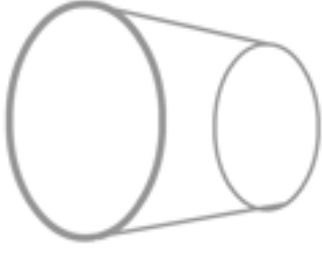

***And don't forget to give thanks to Jesus for the good things in your life - He is the giver of good gifts and loves you very much.***



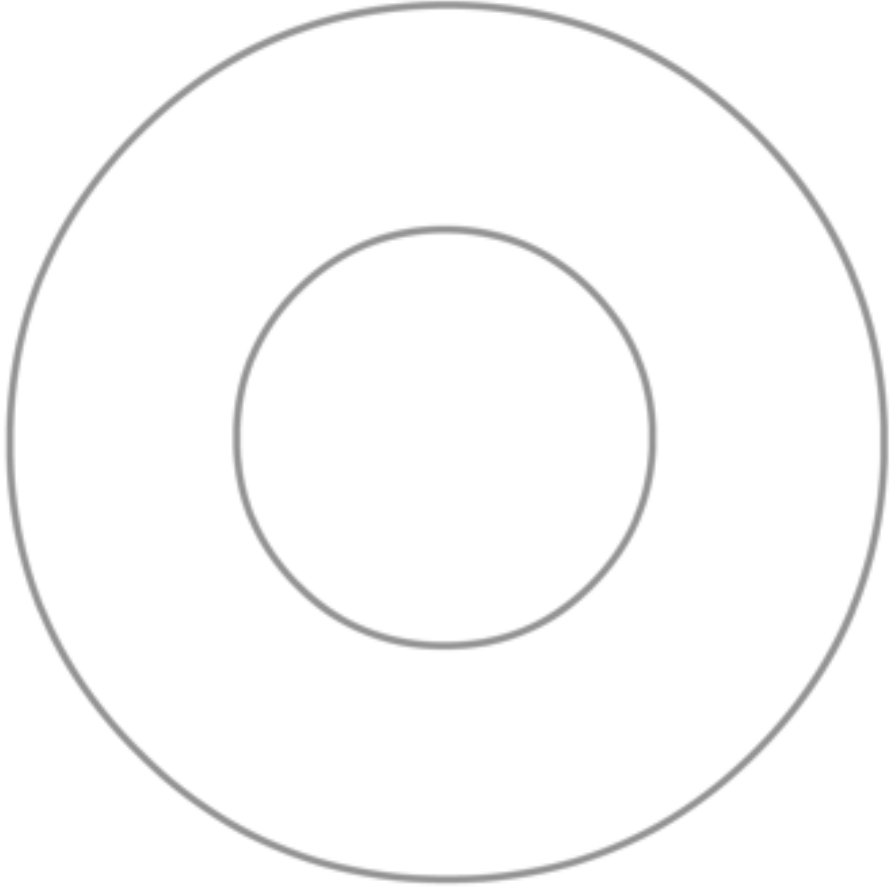

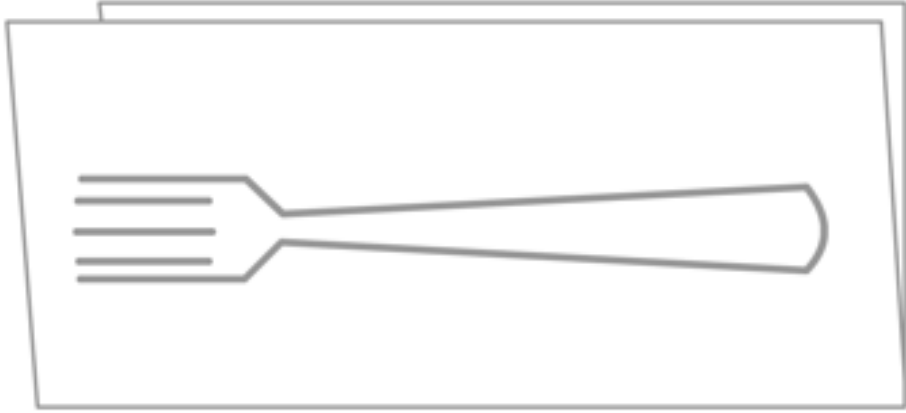

## Activity 4

It is important to have good manners even when you are with your family at home.

Remember etiquette is based on behaviors of kindness, consideration and unselfishness. Talk to a grown up at home to find out all of the jobs that need to be done around the house. Use the chart below to organize the jobs around the house

## Activity 5

Learn how laundry is done in your family. Help with laundry for two weeks. Here are some general guidelines, but every family has a different way:

- Check all pockets
- Check clothing labels for instructions - some clothes should not go in a washing machine.
- Sort laundry by color. Different water temperatures are used for different colors
- Find out how much detergent to use and how to add it to the machine. Every machine is different.
- After washing, find out how to dry clothes - some use dryers or others hang clothing to dry.

# For Leaders



## Virtual Group Options

- You can host a virtual tea party. Have participants set the table at home and you can practice using good manners in conversation. If possible, you could drop off treats and supplies for each participant before the tea party.
- Host the group and practice introductions. Using the script in the Explorers Emblem "Manners" or you can write your own scripts. You may even play manners bingo! Kids will fill up their bingo card throughout the virtual meeting every time they hear someone being polite.
- Schedule a watch party and watch a kids show when the family sits down to Thanksgiving Dinner. After watching discuss when they saw proper etiquette or times they caught someone with bad manners.
- Plan to do Activity 3 remotely together. You can teach about the 10 lepers and then lead a group in a discussion about thankfulness.

## Suggestions for hosting Virtual Groups

Remember many kids who are attending school remotely may be burned out with screen classes. Use your time wisely and be mindful that you may only have a 20-30 minute window. Checking in and building relationships is key! Have fun!
